IHPME RESEARCH DAY

CONNECTING FOR EQUALITY

At IHPME, it's not only sunshine and blossoming trees that signify the arrival of spring. The annual student-led Research Day is another springtime event, one that also brings with it renewal, growth and a sense of optimism.

The renewal of relationships is one reason students, faculty and alumni turn out in strong numbers for the event. As many as 250 people are expected to attend – researchers, health care leaders, policy makers, clinicians from a diverse range of professions. For the first time, the Ontario Telemedicine Network has a booth to raise awareness of their growing impact on health care.

Growth and development of ideas is another feature of Research Day, and the 2015 installment touches on a broad theme. “The organizing committee chose health equity as our theme, which means taking a broader view of the factors that impact access to care and diverse populations,” says Natalie Warick, Research Day Co-Chair, and an IHPME PhD student, who, in 2014, received the Michael Decter Scholarship for Health Leadership and Policy Studies. “Even though we have universal care in Canada, health care is still not equitable, and it is a theme that touches every academic stream at IHPME. For example, my own research focuses on economic supports for caregivers.”

In keeping with the theme of equity, the committee strove to develop a panel discussion that brings together diverse research and policy perspectives on equity in health care. Camille Orridge, Chief Executive Officer of the Toronto Central LHIN, is moderating a panel discussion that includes:

- Arlene Bierman, whose research focuses on improving access,

quality, and outcomes of care for older adults with chronic illness.

- Rick Glazier, whose research interests include equity in health-care delivery for disadvantaged urban populations; and the application of geographic methods in health research.
- Richard Cookson, who is developing methods for incorporating health equity into mainstream health care performance measurement and economic evaluation.
- Angela Robertson, Director of Equity and Community Engagement at Women's College Hospital, and past Executive Director at Sistering: A Woman's Place, a multi-service women's organization for marginalized, low-income and homeless women.
- Rebecca Hammond, who has provided care to diverse communities with a focus on queer and trans health care, spending the past year as an RN with the LGBT program at Sherbourne Health Centre in Toronto.

Keynote speaker Dr. Lisa Simpson, president and CEO of AcademyHealth, a leading organization serving the fields of health services and policy research will address: “Knowing is not enough: Re-inventing child health services research.”

“I am hoping that at the end of Research Day, the audience will be inspired to begin or add new equity perspectives to their work and research. To this end, our dedicated Research Day Committee has been working behind the scenes for months to create this opportunity for our peers and faculty,” said Patti Leake, Co-Chair, IHPME MSc student.
