Project Overview

The Centre for Evidence and Health in All Policies (CEHIAP) is a new multi-centre network coordinated through the University of Toronto. The CEHIAP network is composed of Ontario researchers, academic institutions, and decision-making bodies including: McMaster Health Forum, Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care, Institute for Clinical Evaluative Sciences (ICES), Ottawa Hospital Research Institute, Health Quality Ontario (HQO), Public Health Ontario, and St. Michael's hospital. The center will provide a service to government by conducting research & analyses on complex policy options to provide evidence to support decision-makers when considering different health-related policy options.

The Opportunity

To support the Centre's launch, we are seeking a dynamic individual to provide leadership and strategic guidance for the current execution and future growth of the centre's research and policy work focused on complex health policy interventions.
